Building our Learning Powers

- Across the school a consistent approach to talking about learning.
- A fun and memorable way to get children to understand how they learn and become better and life-long learners.



Resilient Tortoise

Absorption; you become engrossed in what you are doing you are unaware of time passing.

Managing; you know what distracts you, you try to minimise distractions, you settle back quickly after an interruption.

Noticing: you notice how things look, what they are made of, or how they behave, you can identify significant detail.

Perseverance; you are not put off by being stuck, you keep on going despite difficulties and find ways to overcome them, you <u>recognise</u> that learning can be a struggle.



Resourceful Spider

Questioning; you are curious about things and people, you often wonder why, you play with ideas, asking "How come?" and "What if?"

Making Links; you look for connections between experiences or ideas, you find pleasure in seeing how things fit together, you notice patterns.

Imagining; you picture how things might look, sound, feel, be; you let your mind explore and play with possibilities and ideas.

Reasoning: you create logical arguments, you deduce what might happen, you look for evidence.

Capitalising: you use all of the resources available, you think about how you can improve and reach your goals, you use the four B's well.



Reflective Monkey

Planning; you think about what you want to get out of learning, you plan the steps you might take, you access which resources you may need.

Revising; you are ready to revise your plans as you go along, monitor how things are going, change your plans when you've had a better idea.

Distilling; you mull over experiences, draw out useful lessons from experiences, think about where else you might use these lessons.

Meta-Learning; you are interested in how you learn as an individual, know your strengths and weaknesses as a learner, are interested in becoming a better learner.



Reading

- If your child can read they can do anything.
- Please help your child reach their potential and read with them every day.
- New Reading Records Simple but effective communication.
- Group reading 2-3 times per week. Extra individual session for some.



Spelling and Home learning

- Spellings come home on Friday and will be checked the following Friday. These link to the children's phonics and spelling level and will gradually get harder in order to challenge all.
- Mathletics, Purple Mash, Reading Eggs. Log ins available.
- Fortnightly home learning activity linked to class learning
- Sharing any extra learning every day in class.
- All efforts rewarded.



The spelling challenge...

- In order to reach age related expectations for writing children are required by the government to do the following...
- · spell many words correctly using their sounds.
- spell many common exception words.
- add suffixes such as ment, ness, ful, less and ly and spell **some** of these correctly.
- spell **some** words with contracted forms eq don't, haven't, I'll, I'm.
- These are clearly very demanding expectations and therefore in order for us to reach challenging goals we
 need you to help and support your child at home. How can you support your child? Learn weekly spellings
 in whatever way you like, make it fun, short and frequent. Look at, read, notice spelling patterns and ways
 of remembering these in common exception words (these can be found in the middle of the reading record).
 Play word and spelling games at home and notice some spellings when you are reading.
