### **END OF YEAR REVIEW -**

Changes to the organisation of the school, in particular where disabled parking is located has led to more children taking part in physical activity before school. This predominantly boys playing football as opposed to organised activity for all learners.

Attempts have been made to engage before school organised activities such as a running club, but these were not well supported.

Moving forward, we would like to keep this as a focus while building our range of resources to support informal physical activity for all pupils.

To this end, we will make purchasing new outdoor climbing equipment (trim trail) a priority for the next Sports Premium plan.
