While it is not our sole focus, there is no avoiding statutory assessments that all schools in England are required to take part in. This year, we've delivered our very best results against these statutory assessments -


#### Reception -% of children achieving a Good Level of Development -



In Reception, our #InspiredToLearn approach has seen a record number of our children for The Prince of Wales School achieve a 'Good Level of Development' (GLD) with 81% of children achieving this benchmark. We have also seen a record number of children achieve 'exceeding' levels of attainment across the curriculum but especially in Reading where our Read, Write Inc. approach to teaching Phonics has had a massive impact.

Importantly, we have reversed our three-year declining trend in data and built upon the success of last year.

Year 1 - % of children passing the Year 1 Phonics Check -




In Year 1, our #InspiredToLearn approach has seen a record number of our children for The Prince of Wales School achieve a Year 1 Phonics Check 'PASS' with an incredible **93**% of children achieving this benchmark!

Again, our approach to Read, Write Inc. Phonics has been instrumental. A special thank you to all the parents and carers who have supported this programme with lots of 'FRED TALK' at home.

Importantly, in Year 1 we have reversed our poor three-year trend in data and built upon the success of last year.


Year 2 - % of children meeting Age-Related Expectation (ARE) in Reading -

In Year 2, our #InspiredToLearn approach has secured outcomes in line with the national average, despite children's low starting points.


Year 2 - % of children meeting Age-Related Expectation (ARE) in Writing -

In Year 2, our #InspiredToLearn approach has secured outcomes in line with the national average, despite children's low starting points.

Our Year 2 maths data includes data for all 33 children, including those children with 'unit roll' status.

In Year 2, our #InspiredToLearn approach has secured outcomes in line with the national average, despite children's low starting points.

This year's Y2 data also included a record number of children from The Prince of Wales School achieving a 'Greater Depth' level of learning in Reading (26% working at Greater Depth), Writing (16% working at Greater Depth) and Maths (22% working at Greater Depth).

**School Evaluation Partner Visit** - Throughout this year the school, as part of it's continuous improvement journey, has been working with Mr. Mike Randall. Mike, formally the Headteacher of an Outstanding Primary School in Dorset, now works extensively with Ofsted across the South West, South East and Midlands.

Mike has provided substantive challenge to our work and has helped us continue to move forward with the aim of building on our June 2018 'Good' Ofsted rating. Following his most recent visit, Mike writes -

## 'This has been another very successful year for the school.

Thanks to the determination, resilience and passion demonstrated by the headteacher, ably supported by his staff and governors, the school has gone from strength to strength. There is a clear vision, understood and shared by the school community and a very positive ethos pervades across the school. A focused strategic direction is driving continued improvements and the school can provide compelling evidence of how impact of actions have brought about rapid improvements.

Performance of pupils in each year group has been very successful. Good progress has been achieved without narrowing the curriculum.'
