Spellings will continue to be sent home on a Wednesday for the following week. It really does make such a difference with a couple of practices through the week. We have begun teaching the children the cursive style of handwriting that they will increasingly see as time goes on. This has begun by learning the common joins between letters i.e 'ed'. We are also continuing to focus on how we place letters on a line and we will be using the sky/grass/ground visual to help with this.
