Reading, Spelling and Home Learning

Reading – Many children have gained fluency by year 4 and attention switches to the in-depth understanding of the text read. It is still vitally important the children have regular and frequent reading sessions at home and school. This might not just be reading fiction, lots of reading takes place incidentally (signs, instructions, information, newspapers, magazines...). Instead of hearing your child read every night, try the following:

- Reading to younger or older siblings.
- Discussing books, themes and ideas.
- Finding information together in books or on the internet.
- Reading and writing emails.
- Reading newspaper articles together.

Reading in school

- Intense reading in school during RWI session every day. Focus on challenging texts.
- Accelerated Reader Programme
- Library monitors and library time to commence next week.
- Reading to younger children part of year 4's responsibility.
- Reading through every subject expectation for independence in this.
- Individual reading time for those who still need it and 1:1 supported reading to help children who need to catch up.

Reading, Spelling and Home Learning

Spelling – Our RWI sessions encompass all spelling activities that your child requires. Spellings will come home weekly for those children in RWI Spelling Groups.

Those children revising phonics still need to be focusing on reading activities and recognising using phonetic spelling techniques.

Weekly home learning tasks will contain one element of English or Maths. Homeworks will be provided each Friday, normally to be returned by the following Friday.

Reading, Spelling and Home Learning

Home learning – We send home learning home on a weekly basis.

- Develop or review a particular area of learning.
- To prepare children for the expectations to complete home learning at middle school.

Many children are motivated to complete their homework and all efforts are praised. We try to make the activities accessible to all and fun so that the children are motivated to do them, although home learning is not compulsory we do positively encourage children to have a go and chase up those who do not return it.

All home learning is blogged and a paper copy is given out on Friday to be returned for the following Friday unless otherwise stated.
