


POW PASSPORT 2020/21 PARENT GUIDE



What is the POW Passport?

Every child at The Prince of Wales School has their own 'POW Passport' that is kept at home. The purpose of the POW Passport is to provide clarity in -

- Vision and Ethos
- Organisation Values and Mindset (BLP)
- School Specialisms

The POW Passport helps children celebrate progress through -

- Marking significant milestones
- Inspiring goal setting
- Increasing aspiration

When do we bring the POW Passport to school?

Whenever a 'milestone' has been met, children should bring their POW Passport to school to stamp their corresponding milestone. Evidence of met milestones should be stored in the plastic wallet provided.

When will progress be checked and by who?

Mr. Spracklen will check children's progress with their POW Passports once per term on the following dates -

Reception Class -

Week Commencing - Monday 22nd February 2021

Week Commencing - Monday 14th June 2021

Year One Class -

Week Commencing - Monday 9th November 2020

Week Commencing - Monday 1st March 2021

Week Commencing - Monday 21st June 2021

Year Two Class -

Week Commencing - Monday 16th November 2020

Week Commencing - Monday 8th March 2021

Week Commencing - Monday 28th June 2021

Year Three Class -

Week Commencing - Monday 23rd November 2020

Week Commencing - Monday 15th March 2021

Week Commencing - Monday 5th July 2021

Year Four Class -

Week Commencing - Monday 30th November 2020

Week Commencing - Monday 22nd March 2021

Week Commencing - Monday 12th July 2021

When should specific milestones be met?

There are no hard rules of when and how milestones are met. The POW Passport is provided as a personal aid and should always be seen as optional.

A small number of milestones should be seen as 'school specific' and will be covered through planned school-led activities. These are listed below for your convenience -

- Be A Year 4 Buddy All children in Year 4 will always be given the opportunity to be a 'Year 4 Buddy'
- Sleep in a Roundhouse All children in Year 4 will always be given the opportunity to 'Sleep in a Roundhouse'
- **Dress as an Evacuee** All children in Year 3 or Year 4 will always be given the opportunity to 'Dress as an Evacuee'
